



HUMANS AND OTHER ANIMALS

**SEPT. 17-20** - This documentary takes viewers on an epic journey—from witnessing firsthand how animals think, use language and feel love, to dangerous investigations of powerful industries using custom-built surveillance equipment and never-before-attempted tactics. Inquiries into evolution, animals’ emotional intelligence and the deconstruction of speciesism lay the groundwork for a profound philosophical idea that may forever change how we view other animals...and ourselves. THE UNRULY MYSTIC: SAINT HILDEGARD

**SEPT. 17** - Discover why Saint Hildegard von Bingen is the patron saint of creativity, and how her influence resonates today. The 12th-century abbess was a Christian mystic and visionary. Hildegard von Bingen was also a musical composer, writer, and healer that created natural remedies widely used in Europe today. She is venerated worldwide by theologians, artists, musicians, medical practitioners, and educators. This film is a celebration of one woman’s legacy and a reminder that we should listen, seek calmness, and heed the calling of our souls while healing any unruliness that may exist underneath. SANS SOUCI: LOCALS ONLY | SEPT. 21 & 24

Colorado-based films and artists pepper this lineup, representing the diverse dancers of the Front Range and beyond, of various ages, abilities, and styles. **HILDEGARD SPEAKS | SEPT. 21** - Dr. Annette Esser is a German theologian, teacher and artist. In 2017, she co-initiated the Hildegard of Bingen Pilgrimage Way along the historic sites where the Saint lived in the 12th century. She edited the 59 tableaux texts along the Way. In 2019, Dr. Esser was filmed speaking as Hildegard for nine videos. This short video series was created by pilgrim-filmmaker, Michael M. Conti, creator of The Unruly

Mystic: Saint Hildegard.

CLASSICS WITH JEFFREY KASH: I KNOW WHERE I’M GOING | SEPT. 22

From the prestigious Powell and Pressburger team comes a story of learning the difference between money and happiness. A young Englishwoman goes to the Hebrides to marry her older, wealthier fiancé. When the weather keeps them separated on different islands, she begins to have second thoughts. (Michael Powell & Emeric Pressburger, 1945, UK, 1:32, NR)

BY THE STREAM | SEPT. 24-28

Jeonim, a lecturer, persuades her uncle to direct her school’s theatrical skit due to his past experience. While sketching near a stream, a scandalous incident involving students occurs, implicating Jeonim and her uncle. For his 32nd feature film, Hong Sangsoo returns to the campus setting of films like Oki’s Movie (2010) and Our Sunhi (2013) and revisits thematic concerns and modes of expression he hasn't touched on in his cinema for some time. IT’S NEVER OVER, JEFF BUCKLEY

**SEPT. 24-28** - With bonus 26 minutes of live performance only available in theaters, not online. Never-before-seen footage, exclusive voice messages, and accounts from Jeff Buckley’s inner circle paint a captivating portrait of the gifted musician who died tragically in 1997, having only released one album. NATIONAL SILENT MOVIE DAY: BATTLESHIP POTEMKIN| SEPT. 29

- We believe that silent motion pictures are a vital, beautiful, and often powerful part of film history. With the most famous and most quoted film sequence in cinema history, Battleship Potemkin has inspired generations of filmmakers. In the midst of the Russian Revolution of 1905, the crew of the battleship Potemkin mutiny against the brutal, tyrannical regime of the vessel’s officers. The resulting street demonstration in Odessa brings on a police massacre. (Sergei Eisenstein, 1925, Soviet Union, 1:09, NR)

FRIDAY NIGHT WEIRD

ABRAHAM’S BOYS | SEPT. 5

Extending the Dracula canon, this generational drama follows Max and Rudy Van Helsing, who have spent their lives under the strict and overprotective rule of their father, Abraham. Unaware of his dark past, they struggle to understand his paranoia and increasingly erratic behavior. But when they begin to uncover the violent truths behind their father’s history with Dracula, their world unravels, forcing them to confront the terrifying legacy they were never meant to inherit. **HARVEST | SEPT. 12** - Over seven hallucinatory days, a village with no name, in an undefined time and place, disappears. Townsman-turned-farmer Walter Thirsk and befuddled lord of the manor Charles Kent are childhood friends about to face an invasion from the outside world: the trauma of modernity. (Athina Rachel Tsangari, 2025, UK, 2:13, NR)

SOMNIUM | SEPT. 19

Years into their relationship, Tim and Millie find themselves at a crossroads as they move to the country. With tensions already flaring, an encounter with an unnatural force threatens to corrupt their lives, their love and their flesh. (Michael Shanks, 2025, Australia, 1:42, R)

SANATORIUM UNDER THE SIGN OF THE HOURGLASS | SEPT. 26

- A stop-motion/ live-action masterpiece inspired by the works of Jewish-Polish author and artist Bruno Schulz. A ghostly train journey on a forgotten branch line transports a son, Jozef, visiting his dying Father in a remote Galician Sanatorium. Upon arrival, Jozef finds the Sanatorium entirely moribund and run by a dubious Doctor Gotard, who tells him that his father’s death, the death that has struck him in his country, has not yet occurred and that here they are always late by a certain interval of time of which the length cannot be defined. Jozef will come to realize that the Sanatorium is a floating world halfway between sleep and wakefulness. (Stephen Quay & Timothy Quay. 2025, UK/Poland, 1:15, NR)
