

**AN OFFICER AND A SPY | DEC. 3-7** - On January 5, 1895, Captain Alfred Dreyfus, a young promising officer, is degraded for spying for Germany and is sentenced to life imprisonment on Devil's Island. Among the witnesses to his humiliation is Georges Picquart, who is promoted to run the military counter-intelligence unit that tracked him down. But when Picquart discovers that secrets are still being handed over to the Germans, he is drawn into a dangerous labyrinth of deceit and corruption that threatens not just his honour but his life. (Roman Polanski, 2019, France, 2:12, NR)

**ORWELL: 2+2=5 | DEC. 3-7** - George Orwell was one of the most radical and visionary authors of the 20th Century, whose 1940s novels, such as 1984 and Animal Farm, foretold a chilling, all-too-believable authoritarian future that has become scarily prescient in our modern era. Acclaimed director Raoul Peck (I Am Not Your Negro), working in collaboration with the Orwell Estate, seamlessly interweaves historical

clips, readings from Orwell's diary, cinematic references, and dynamic modern day footage to craft not only a definitive portrait of the writer himself, but an entirely fresh take on how remarkably relevant and prophetic his work has become. Featuring award-winning actor Damian Lewis as the voice of Orwell. (Raoul Peck, 2025, USA/France, 1:59, R)

**SENTIMENTAL VALUE | DEC. 10-14** - Sisters Nora and Agnes reunite with their estranged father, the charismatic Gustav, a once-renowned director who offers stage actress Nora a role in what he hopes will be his comeback film. When Nora turns it down, she soon discovers he has given her part to an eager young Hollywood star. Suddenly, the two sisters must navigate their complicated relationship with their father — and deal with an American star dropped right into the middle of their complex family dynamics. **CHECKPOINT ZOO | DEC. 10-14** - Set in the early days of Russia's invasion of Ukraine,

this gripping documentary follows Kharkiv's Feldman Ecopark Zoo as it's caught in the crossfire, leaving over 5,000 animals trapped and starving near the advancing front line. After a desperate plea from founder Oleksandr Feldman goes viral, zoos across Ukraine and Europe offer refuge, inspiring staff and volunteers to risk their lives sneaking back into the war zone to evacuate thousands of animals, including dangerous predators, to safety. **NATIONAL THEATER LIVE: MRS. WARREN'S PROFESSION | DEC. 14 & 16** - Five-time Olivier Award winner Imelda Staunton (The Crown) joins forces with her real-life daughter Bessie Carter (Bridgerton) for the very first time, playing mother and daughter in Bernard Shaw's incendiary moral classic. Filmed live from the West End, this new production reunites Staunton with director Dominic Cooke (Follies, Good), exploring the clash between morality and independence, traditions and progress. 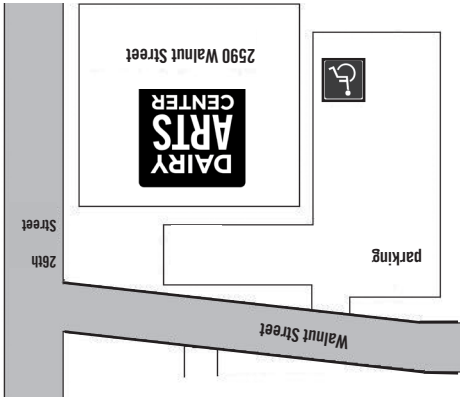

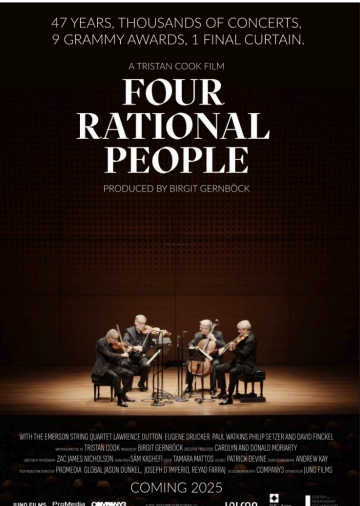
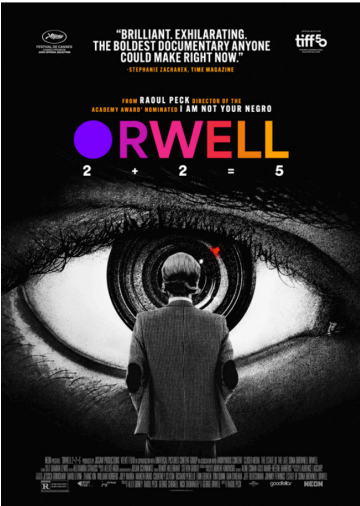

**FOUR RATIONAL PEOPLE | DEC. 17-21**  
Goethe once said that a string quartet is like “a conversation between FOUR RATIONAL PEOPLE,” and for the members of the Emerson String Quartet, that conversation is coming to a bittersweet ending as they embark on their final season of a fifty-year history that includes 9 GRAMMY Awards and thousands of concerts. At once a frank examination of the tyranny of aging and a cri de cœur to pass the torch to a new generation of artists, the film culminates with one final Emerson Quartet performance for the ages, leaving all to ponder what happens to us after the final curtain. **THE TALE OF SILYAN | DEC. 26-30**

From the Oscar-nominated director of 'Honeyland' comes a poignant and visually arresting documentary set in the heart of rural Macedonia. Nikola, a farmer grappling with the harsh realities of new government policies, finds himself unable to sell his land or crops. When his family leaves in search of a better life abroad, Nikola takes a job as a landfill attendant, where he encounters the injured white stork Silyan. As he nurses the bird back to health, an unlikely bond forms between man and animal. A deeply moving film that touches on climate change, economic migration, resilience and the quiet power of connection. (Tamara Kotevska, 2025, North Macedonia, 1:21, PG)

**THE CARPENTER'S SON | DEC. 26**  
A remote village in Roman-era Egypt explodes into spiritual warfare when a carpenter, his wife and their child are targeted by supernatural forces. Joseph (Nicolas Cage), Mary (FKA twigs) and their teenage son Jesus (Noah Jupe) have lived for years under threat, clinging to their faith and traditions. Writer and director Lotfy Nathan, drawing from his Coptic Christian background, delivers a meticulously crafted, genre-bending supernatural thriller packed with unshakeable images of the divine and demonic at war.
